There are a number of families buried in the Dissenters Graveyard in Exeter who have connections with the meeting house in Moretonhampstead. William Bidder was baptised there on 25 December 1768<sup>1</sup> and married Elizabeth Parker in Moretonhampstead on 7 July 1793<sup>2</sup>. William's parents, William and Ann (nee Harden) had married in Moretonhampstead on 16 June 1756.<sup>3</sup>



The chest tomb in the graveyard bears the inscription:

William and Elizabeth Bidder had nine children, six boys and three girls. Elizabeth Mary Bidder was their fourth child and her baptism was recorded by the Rev. Mr Rowland in the register at the Cross Presbyterian Meeting House in Moretonhampstead "March 2<sup>nd</sup> was born Elis Mary Daughter of W<sup>m</sup> & Elis Bidder Baptized April 7<sup>th</sup> 1802".<sup>4</sup> Henry John was their last child and was born on 22 September 1816. He was baptised the following year on 15 February 1817 by Thomas Edwards at the Cross Presbyterian Meeting House in Moretonhampstead.<sup>5</sup>

William and Elizabeth's third son, George Parker Bidder, was born on 13 June 1806.<sup>6</sup> George became very well known as "The Calculating Prodigy" and travelled the country demonstrating his skills. He answered questions from Queen Charlotte in the winter of 1816 - 1817 and went on to study at Edinburgh University. George became a Civil Engineer and worked for many years on the railways with Robert and George Stephenson.<sup>7</sup>

At some point William and Elizabeth moved to Exeter. They lived at Albany Place in St Thomas and it was here that Henry John (an unmarried tailor), William (a stone mason) and Elizabeth died. All three of the notices in the paper announcing their deaths refer to their relationship with George Parker Bidder "...the celebrated mental calculator..."<sup>8</sup>
