## Elizabeth Parminter (nee Bretland) died 1835

Elizabeth Parminter (c.1758-1835)<sup>1,2</sup> was a cousin of the Reverend Joseph Bretland and was remembered in his Will ...

"I also give and bequeath to my cousin Elizabeth Parminter widow of the late John Vowler Parminter of Bideford in the County of Devon 600 pounds ..."<sup>3</sup>

John Vowler Parminter (1739-1792) was a prominent member of George's Meeting in Exeter<sup>4</sup>. Elizabeth was his second wife. They were married at St Martin, Exeter on 17th December 1777<sup>5</sup>. The marriage was recorded in the diary of a gentleman, Samuel Curwen, who was visiting the City at the time ...

December 18<sup>th</sup> 1777: "Cloudy, moderate. City alarmed by unexpected marriage of a Mr Parminter of 40 years of age with Betsey Bretland my old landlady's younger Dau[gh]ter but 20 years old with scarce a gown to her back; this probably would cease after 7 days ..."

Contrary to expectation the marriage did last. The first child, Richard, was born in 1779 and baptised on 8<sup>th</sup> May by Rev.Micaijah Towgood.<sup>7</sup>

John's parents, Richard Parminter and Rebecca Vowler were both from wealthy families and he no doubt inherited from them in his turn. His career began with an apprenticeship to his Uncle, Samuel Parminter, in Samuel's Exeter grocery business<sup>8</sup>. By 1787 he and Elizabeth were living in Bideford where he was listed in the Universal British Directory of 1791 as "Salt Officer". Two further children were born. John Bretland Parminter in 1787 and Sophia Parminter in 1789.

John Bretland and Sophia were baptised at the Great Independent Meeting at Bideford by the Rev Samuel Lavington. John Bretland on 22<sup>nd</sup> March 1787 and Sophia on 18<sup>th</sup> November 1789. The birth register entries describe their father John as a "*Gentleman*" of Bideford and there is a small note against the entry for John Bretland "*died*"<sup>9</sup>

John Vowler Parminter died in Bideford in 1792 and was buried on 12<sup>th</sup> July<sup>10</sup>.

Elizabeth moved back to Exeter with Sophia where they entered into a partnership with Sarah Bretland as "*keepers of a boarding school*". The partnership with Sarah was dissolved in 1813<sup>11</sup> but Elizabeth and Sophia continued the business and advertised their "Ladies' Boarding and Day-School" in the Exeter Flying Post of 6<sup>th</sup> January 1814.

An obituary notice published in the Western Times on 4<sup>th</sup> April 1835 records Elizabeth's death on Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> April at her home in Magdalen Street. She was buried on 8<sup>th</sup> April 1835 and the funeral was conducted by Rev Henry Acton<sup>2</sup>.

Sophia continued to live in Exeter and can be traced through the census records from 1841 to 1881 living in Fair Park, St Leonards. She had an independent income and employed a servant and later a servant and a cook. In 1881 she was described as a "Landowner and

Holder of Bank Stock"<sup>12</sup>. She died on 30<sup>th</sup> December 1883, aged 94. At that time she lived at 2, Fair Park and her personal estate was valued at £3,165 5s 6d<sup>13</sup>.

Sophia's older brother Richard died in India in 1819. His death was reported in the Exeter Flying Post of 1<sup>st</sup> June 1820 ..

"At Vizanagram, in the East Indies, on the 16<sup>th</sup> of October last, in his 41<sup>st</sup> year, Major R. Parminter, of the 6<sup>th</sup> Native Infantry, son of the late John Vowler Parminter, Esq. of this city."
