**ANN GLYDE** (Written 1822)

This is the last will and testament of me Ann Glyde of Saint Thomas the apostle in the county of Devon widow I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah Glyde the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds to my daughter Mary Glyde the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds to my daughter Elizabeth Glyde the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds and to my daughter Melina Glyde the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds the said four legacies to be paid within three months after my decease All my household furniture linen plate china books and other articles of household I give and bequeath unto my three daughters Sarah Elizabeth and Melina equally to be divided between them on my decease I give and bequeath unto my son Jonathan Lavington Glyde the sum of two hundred pounds to be placed by him at interest or in the public funds and upon trust to pay the interest thereof to my daughter Abigail Cayme for and during her natural life to and for her own(?) sole and separate use independent of her husband and her receipt alone to be a sufficient discharge(?) for the same and from and after her decease in trust for all and every the children of the said Abigail Cayme the interest thereof to be applied by my said trustee in their maintenance during their minorities or accumulate(?) in the discretion of my said trustee and the said capital sum of two hundred pounds to be divided between and paid to such of the said children as shall attain the age of twenty one years at that age with benefit of survivorship between the said children only I give and bequeath to the said Abigail Cayme all my wearing apparel of every description All the rest residue and remainder of my personal estate and effects I give and bequeath unto my said son to and for his own use and benefit and appoint him sole executor of this my last will and testament in witness(?) thereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this second day of January in the year of our lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty two **Ann Glyde** signed sealed published and declared by the said Ann Glyde as and for her last will and testament in the presence of us (-?) (-?) present at her request and in the presence of each other have hereunto set our names as witnesses(?) thereto the (-?) of or between the (-?) and (-?) (-?) having(?) been made before the execution(?) *Mary Williams, Rachel Williams*



Proved at London 6<sup>th</sup> March 1826 before the judge by the oath of Jonathan Lavington Glyde the son and sole executor to whom administration was granted being first sworn by commission duly to administer.
