## **CLEMENT HIRTZEL**

The Last Will and Testament of me **Clement Hirtzel of Exeter Merchant** I give to **my Mother** One hundred guineas To **my sister Mrs Catherine Kingdon** Three hundred guineas To **my Brother George** Three hundred guineas To **my nephew Clement Hirtzel Kingdon** ffifty guineas to be paid in six months after my death To **Mrs Elizabeth Stockham** ffive pounds a year for life To **Mrs Elizabeth Chilcott** ffive guineas to **Betty Burden** Ten guineas to **Mr John Holmes and Mrs Holmes** ffive guineas each To the **Governors and Treasurer of the Devon and Exeter Hospital** Thirty pounds the said Legacies to be paid as soon as conveniently can be after my death To **Mr Matthew Leycombe** Ten guineas To **my nephew William Page Kingdon** ffive guineas payable in like manner to **my Mother** my gold watch All the remainder of my goods chattels and effects I give to **my Brother John James** and make him executor hereof In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal **the 4<sup>th</sup> December 1781 Clem<sup>t</sup>. Hirtzel** signed sealed published and declared by the said Clement Hirtzel as and for his last Will and Testament - **Joseph Earle – W<sup>m</sup>. Sanford**

**This Will was proved at London the fourth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty two** before the Right Worshipful Peter Calvert Doctor of Laws Master Keeper or Commissary of the Prerogative Court of Canterbury lawfully constituted by the oath of **John James Hirtzel the Brother of the deceased and sole executor** named in the said Will to whom administration was granted of all and singular the goods chattels and credits of the said deceased he having been first sworn by commission duly to administer.
